Murshidabad Heritage Festival - Resurgence 2011

The first heritage festival in Murshidabad, "Resurgence - Murshidabad Heritage Festival 2011" was organized by the Tourism Department of Govt. of West Bengal in association with Murshidabad Heritage Development Society and with the support of Crafts Council of West Bengal, West Bengal Kayaking & Canoeing Association, Union Ministry of Culture, Art of Living Foundation and others in Azimganj, Jiaganj and Lalbagh-Nashipur on 17 & 18 December, 2011. The festival brought to the fore the Sheherwali Cuisine, Sheherwali Cuisine Recipe book, a Boat Race on the River Bhagirathi, Cultural Programme/Entertainment, Competitions for the Youth, Crafts Bazar, Puja and Jain Temple Visits. A gathering of 3000 invitees enjoyed the two-day festival. A souvenir recording the festival was published by the Society.

Swimming Competition





For 69 years, the world's longest open-water swimming competition is being conducted on the Bhagirathi River by Murshidabad Swimming Association. It started from Jangipur and finished at Berhampore, 81 KM away. On 2 September 2012, your Society sponsored the second part of the Competition that began from Jiaganj and finished at Berhampore 19 KM away. Besides swimmers from different states of India, it attracted competitors from the neighbouring countries also. The sporting spirit witnessed, especially in some handicapped competitors, was marvellous.

Sheherwali Cuisine Dinner





Consultant Chefs got fascinated by the distinctiveness of the Sheherwali cuisine. They encouraged ITC Sonar, Kolkata to host a sampling of the cuisine in September 2012. Several members of the Society, in traditional attire, explained the delicate ways of the culinary experience. It is hoped that some of the distinctive dishes of this cuisine will be incorporated in various menus.

Support for the New Yatri Niwas

A new Yatri Niwas is under construction in Jiaganj. Many members participated at its Bhumi Puja in 2011. Members of the Society have aided the designing of the Yatri Niwas. On the request of the Acharya Padmasagar Suri Charitable Trust, Jiaganj, the Society has sponsored a room at the Yatri Niwas.

Support to architecture students

The Society facilitated and gave liberal support to two students of Architecture who chose Murshidabad for their thesis. One interviewed senior members of the Society to prepare her thesis on "Built Heritage and Lifestyle of Sheherwalis". The other did extensive work at Katgola Gardens for her paper "The Heritage Park at Katgola".

Restoration Guide

Technique for plastering old structures using lime & sand

Lime and fine sand mortar mix ratio 15kgs: 90kgs

- Sieve fine sand to remove gravel and impurities. Soak the lime in water for 3 days to mature it. Then mix the sand and lime as mortar. The mortar will be ready for plastering. After plastering, water-cure for 7 days.
- Water-cure the brick work that requires plaster for 3 days. Sieve fine sand to remove gravel and impurities. Mix the sand and lime with water. Soak the mix in water for 1 day. The mortar will be ready for plastering. After plastering, water-cure for 7 days.

His Holiness Sri Sri Ravi Shankar visit to Murshidabad





On 4 March 2013 HH Sri Sri Ravi Shankar addressed a packed house at the Jain Kothi Azimganj. The invitees were the members of Murshidabad Heritage Development Society, Azimganj Shree Sangh, Jiaganj Shree Sangh, Councillors of the Azimganj Jiaganj Municipality and members of the Art of Living Founda-tion, including 7/8 foreigners from different countries of South America (Peru, Brazil and Argentina) and Canada. He recalled the function at Netaji Indoor Stadium; talked about love and happiness; asked the assembly to get involved in the preservation of Murshidabad's rich heritage and blessed everyone present with peace.

Before leaving Azimganj, HH took delight in the restoration of Bari Kothi, blessed hundreds of devotees while visiting the new temple at Rambagh and was mesmerised by the majesty of the Katgola Palace.

Launch of Ladies Wing





To make the activities more inclusive, a Ladies Wing of the Society was launched at Kolkata on 28 April 2013. Members discussed various projects that the Ladies Wing could undertake like a Mango Fest, a Book on Mangoes, another edition of the Sheherwali Cuisine Recipe book, Archiving of Textile collections for a museum and several aspects of the Murshidabad Heritage Festival. It is hoped that these activities would help the Lady members to take up responsibilities and shine.

Vocational Training Centre

A Vocational Training Centre for electrical and electronics has been set up in Jiaganj in collaboration with Schneider Electric and SSRDP Trust. This is training people for gainful employment. Skills training and a placement service will also be looked at in future.

Lobbying with Eastern Railway

A much larger number of people have started visiting Murshidabad for heritage and spiritual tourism, for commercial and trade purposes, for studying the ethos and lifestyle of various groups for repairs and renovations to various temples and monuments, for film making etc. With the oncoming Murshidabad Heritage Festival, the Society lobbied with Eastern Railways to increase the number of coaches and trains to and from Murshidabad. Thanks to these efforts, the Railways made a prompt study and increased the number of Air-conditioned coaches. The study has put in place steps to help the railways to increase the number of coaches when the traffic goes up further.

Preservation Heroes:

Bari Kothi in Azimganj

The Society inspired some stake-holders to restore the heritage of palatial structures.

'Bari Kothi', inspired by Greek and Roman architecture and built in the 17 century was one of the most handsome palatial buildings in Azimganj. It housed, amongst others, a beautiful Sheesh Mahal and a drawing room with exquisite hand-painted artwork on its tiled walls. It was the residence of Rai Bahadur Budh Sing Dudhoria and his descendants. In a recent development, scion of this family, Pradip Kumar Sing and brother Sudip Kumar Sing Dudhoria acquired the heritage portion of 'Bari Kothi' from their Uncle.

As part of their enthusiasm and commitment towards restoring and preserving heritage, they intend to restore it to its former glory. They believe that it a responsibility of each and every family that has interest in such heritage structures, to preserve their legacy for future generations.

Bhairavji Mandir In Azimganj

A small temple of Bhairavji beside the train tracks in Azimganj used to command a big following. However, with people migrating from Azimganj it lay in a state of neglect and disrepair. Recently some members of the Kothari family including Pradip Kothari, now settled in Hyderabad, got together to restore the temple and beautified it. It has now restarted attracting a big following. The Kothari family and all those involved in this restoration need to be commended for this.



Sambhavnath Mandir In Azimganj

The temple of Lord Sambhavnath, with its huge 'Pratima', next to the train tracks in Azimganj has been repaired and newer facilities for pilgrims have been provided. Recipe of a favourite Sheherwali Dish

Wheat flour

Ingredients - (Good for 4 people)

Channa dal - 100 gms.

• Ginger - 1 inch

Refined oil - Half cup
 Asafoetida(hing) - a pinch

nch • Green Chilli

- 200 gms

Green Chilli - 2-3 pcs.

Mustard seed - Half tbsp

• Grated coconut - 2 tbsp

Preparation

Soak channa dal in water for 4 hours. Grind into a thick paste with ginger and chilli. Put salt to taste.

Put 3 tbsp oil and half tsp salt to flour and knead a soft dough with water. Keep aside for ½ hour. Break the dough into small balls and roll out like chapattis. Spread the channa dal paste evenly on the chapattis. Roll the chapattis. Boil water in a big pan and put in the rolls for 2-3 minutes. Take the rolls out of the water. Let it cool. Cut the rolls into one inch pieces.

Heat 3 tbsp oil in a pan and put mustard seeds in it. When mustard seeds start crackling, put a pinch of asafoetida, this is the 'baghar'. Add the baghar to the cut rolls. Garnish with grated coconut. Serve with dhania chutney.
